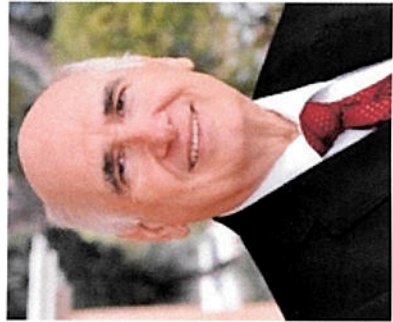
Imagine a New Kind of University...
