1 John 3:1 ESV "See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are."



We have a small UWF group in our church in Monroe. We spent much of the last year with three of us on zoom. Even as a small group, we were able to fellowship and support one another. As our church reopened, we asked our Lutheran sisters (we share a building and a pastor and are exploring uniting into a

single congregation) to join us. Our numbers swelled to nine one month and I was excited about the direction our local unit was headed. But, as summer approached, and activities increased, we saw a drop. Then we decided to close out our school year with a summer potluck. There were four of us. One was a good friend, and one was my mother. There were multiple reasons why. A few women were recovering from injuries. A few more were out of town or had scheduling conflicts. And then we discovered we had COVID positive cases at our church service the Sunday before and everyone was concerned about spreading or contracting the virus. I was very disappointed.

I received multiple apologies and regrets. I had to keep reminding myself that ministry isn't a popularity contest, and it isn't just about the results as much as the seeds being planted. I had mailed invitations to every woman in both congregations. I knew I wasn't likely to get a huge response (although I wanted that!) but I hoped that every woman would hear the message that they are welcome in our group; they are wanted in our group. We're going to try another potluck in the Fall to kick off the new year instead of wrapping up the old one. I'm going to spend the summer reminding myself that it's not my job to fill the seats, it's God's job. He's at work even when I can't see it. So, say a prayer for me and our budding group and I will do the same. And I'll watch for God's work in anticipation of His blessings whether I am gifted with seeing those seeds bloom or just the peace to know they are being planted.

Plan 1: 5 books a year

Plan 2: 10 books a year

Plan 3: 15 books a year

Read two books from each category, plus "5" additional books from any category and regular reading of "response" magazine.

Plan 4: 20 books a year

Read two books from each category, plus "10" additional books from any category and regular reading of "response" magazine.

Hi Ladies:

On June 2. I checked out "Faith Talks" for the first time. The topic was "Friendship and Forgiveness." Jennifer R. Farmer was the host. She said "To sustain relationships, one must learn forgiveness. To live well, one must learn forgiveness. To enjoy emotional freedom, one must forgive." Other participants in the Faith Talk were Amanda Hoyt (Jennifer's friend) and the Reverend Cheryl Taylor of St. John AME Church.

I found the Faith Talk very inspiring (much like a good sermon at church) and the speakers had good ideas on how to forgive someone.

Rev. Taylor felt forgiveness is not an option. She suggested first praying to God for guidance and then asking God to help you to forgive that person. She said "healing comes from forgiving and forgiving is a continual process."

Jennifer said "Forgiveness does not mean reengaging in toxic and unhealthy relationships; it is a means of freeing us from the harm done to us."

I strongly encourage members to check out Faith Talks if you have the opportunity. If you listen to two Faith Talks, they will count as a book read in the Spiritual Growth category of the Reading Program and three Faith Talks count as a bonus book in the same category.

From the Nurturing for Community category of the 2022 Reading Program is "Before We Were Yours" by Lisa Wingate. "Born into a world of wealth and privilege, Avery Stafford seems to have it all. A loving daughter to her father, a US senator, with her own ambitious career as a lawyer, and a handsome fiancé waiting for her in Baltimore, she has lived a charmed life. But when Avery returns to Aiken to help her father weather a health crisis and a political attack, a chance encounter with May Crandall, an elderly woman she's never met before, leaves Avery deeply shaken. Avery's decision to learn more about May's life will take her on a journey through a hidden history of stolen children and illegal adoption. A journey that will reveal a secret that could lead to devastation...or redemption." Based on one of America's most notorious real-life scandals - in which Georgia Tann, director of a Memphis-based adoption organization, kidnapped and sold poor children to wealthy families all over the country. [from OCLC World Cat summary]

Described as a "riveting tale," I would wholeheartedly agree. I read this page-turning novel in 3 days. The novel was presented as a mystery and I needed to know how the characters were connected. I strongly recommend this novel as a good read.

A Note from the Editor


