REMEMBERING ELIZABETH MAXWELL WILLIAMS

1957 - 2022



Elizabeth Maxwell Williams passed away peacefully on November 30, 2022, after courageously battling brain cancer for over a year.

Elizabeth was born on April 19, 1957, in Seattle, Washington, to Rev. William "Bill" and Laura Virginia "Ginny" (McManaway) Andrews. A United Methodist clergy family, Elizabeth's family lived and served in many communities throughout her childhood, including Seattle, Sunnyside, Pasco, and Shelton. She graduated in 1975 from Shelton High School and in 1979 from the University of Puget Sound, where she studied psychology and recreation. Elizabeth was a gifted athlete, competing in track, cross-country, and cross-country skiing.

Elizabeth's greatest joy in life was spending time with her four children, Crystal, Andrew, Marla, and Aric, and she was always eager to share how proud she was of each of them. Elizabeth raised her family in Ocean Shores, Eatonville, Port Hadlock,

Snohomish, and Spokane. A faithful Christian, she was drawn by her faith to passionate action and advocacy in caring for God's creation. She was actively involved in the environmental organizations 350 Spokane and the United Methodist Climate Justice Movement and was Social Action Coordinator for PNW United Women in Faith. She loved her work in recreation therapy at Providence St. Joseph's Care Center, bringing joy to the residents through costumes, jokes, and creative activities.

Elizabeth is survived by her four children, Crystal Natland (Cody), Andrew Williams (Alanna), Marla Williams (David McMorris), and Aric Williams; three grandchildren, Charley, Aleeha, and Cedar; brothers Bill and David; and many nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her parents, Bill and Ginny Andrews.

A memorial service will be held on Sunday, December 18th, at 3:00 p.m. at Moran United Methodist Church in Spokane (3601 E 65th Avenue). JULY 21-23, 2023 AT WESLEY UMC, YAKIMA, WA




Come! Let's explore together the heart of Jesus' good news and what fresh vision it offers us as we seek to be in mission today.

2023 CHILDREN'S CURRICULUM – "WE ARE THE KIN-DOM!"





2023 YOUTH CURRICULUM – "SEEK AND YOU SHALL FIND: LIVING IN THE KIN-DOM."



In this youth curriculum, the overarching theme is teaching youth to find the kin-dom within the world around them and how to live what they have learned. Each of the eight sessions builds upon the one before it to introduce participants to finding the kin-dom in the world around them and how to tell others about the kin-dom.

2023 ADULT CURRICULUM – "LIVING THE KIN-DOM: EXPLORING THE LORD'S PRAYER AS A SPIRITUAL PRACTICE FOR SOCIAL TRANSFORMATION."



This curriculum explores the Lord's Prayer as recorded in Matthew 6:9–13. It is an invitation to take a deeper look at prayer and its role in our faith journeys. Moving from personal to communal application, the curriculum explores how the Lord's Prayer helps us "live the kin-dom" and become a reflection of God's love to the world.


ENDOWMENT FUND DISBURSEMENTS FOR 2023

On January 18, 2023, the Endowment Committee adopted the following disbursements for 2023: \$1,183.21 for pledge (25% of the amount available), \$640 for Atlantic Street Center, \$640 for Tacoma Community House, \$640 for Nome Community Center, and \$100 for Legacy. They reserved 1,500 for the Western Jurisdiction Quadrennial Meeting in 2024

The current amount in the Endowment Fund is \$93,000. Our goal is to reach \$100,000.

Last year the legacy contributions were \$765.

MEET SARA KRUM, OUR NEW SOCIAL ACTION COORDINATOR



Greetings,

My name is Sara Krum, and I am your new Mission Coordinator for Social Action here in the Pacific Northwest Conference. A little bit about me: I am a 30-year-old mom of two toddlers and wife to a high school teacher. I have my Bachelor of Science degree in Anthropology and Biology from Iowa State University and my Master of Philosophy degree in Biological Anthropology from the University of Cambridge.

My passion for social action started when I was five years old, helping my parents cook and serve meals for the homeless in our community. My parents are still active volunteers, and I continued this service opportunity until I went away to college. I am grateful to my family for instilling empathy and deep respect for those who provide for others.

When I was in college, I worked for the AVID tutoring program helping middle, and high school students prepare to become first-generation college graduates. My team would work with 7th-grade through college-level students, helping with homework, learning strategies, and study skills. During my work with the AVID program, I found assisting others in succeeding through difficult odds to be very fulfilling; it truly made me feel like I could make a difference for people in the world.

My degrees in anthropology have provided me with a greater understanding of the need to combat inequity for women and children across the globe. Additionally, they have shown me different avenues to appropriately reach out and help those in need. I am very excited for my background in anthropology to help the United Women in Faith further our mission.

Since becoming a mother in 2018, I have become more aware of the problems facing women/birthing people in the US and around the world. I am particularly passionate about making birth safe for women and birthing people in this country. The “spark” for this passion came from the documentary “Aftershock” (which I highly recommend) and a subsequent presentation to my local United Women in Faith chapter. Exploring the disparaging differences in the quality-of-care received by women and birthing people of color while pregnant and postpartum, I quickly found how detrimental these issues

are to our communities. I hope we, as United Women in Faith, will be able to help with this epidemic.

I did not grow up going to church but started participating with my friends in high school. My husband grew up in the United Methodist Church, and when we met, I felt instantly drawn to this community. My family and I joined Wesley United Methodist Church here in Yakima last September when we moved back to the Pacific Northwest. I joined the local United Women in Faith unit in May of 2022 and, after sharing ideas, was elected their social action coordinator.

My faith has been intricately linked to my passion for social action. I believe the church’s main job in our communities is to be a beacon of hope and life. To do this, we must continue providing meaningful services for those in need, advocate for our communities, and actively participate in local life. Our motto at Wesley UMC is “Caring for Christ, Community, and Creation,” which perfectly describes our mission and values as United Women in Faith.

I invite you to reach out as we seek ways to do more, help more, and be more for women and children. I am honored to accept this position and excited to continue the meaningful work of United Women in Faith!

TREASURER'S MESSAGE

We are closing out 2022 with being able to meet and exceed our Conference Pledge to Missions. The Pledged amount voted on was \$45,000, and we were able to donate \$78,421. This amount included \$2,394 sent by some of you directly to the National Office. Another \$1,121 was earmarked to the Pledge from the Endowment Distribution received in early 2022. This leaves \$74,905 received from local units to the districts and onto the Conference to be sent to National Office in New York City.

It is also the time of year when audits are being done on the books. Please plan to get them done soon and send the report to me. This is especially important for the districts. I have the forms and instructions if needed.

The state needs to catch up on processing its paperwork, so we are still waiting. When that happens, I will be able to move forward with instructions for all of you to change the name and EIN numbers on your bank accounts.
