TREASURER'S MESSAGE

The focus for the newsletter is "Money." Giving is down. It is as simple as that. We in the Northwest have made our pledges to National. But our Pledge amounts are not what they were in the past. We have cut meeting expenses by continuing with some zoom meetings replacing in person meetings. We have a new name, the organization is updating and changing to become more relevant, modern, and efficient. There are churches splitting from the national organization and there are churches and units closing. Members are aging and new membership is not increasing fast enough - just yet! Sometimes funds sit in checking and savings accounts unused maybe saved for good reasons. Maybe most of the giving is for designated projects but little is for the overall running of the organization which is the undesignated mission giving. All are reasons for the changes seen in giving. And they are all happening together in the same time frame.

I am writing all of this to hopefully start conversations about money and giving and what is happening in your unit. Are there areas we can change and try a new idea to raise funds or disperse them differently? Are there conflicts in the group as to where the funds raised should go? Could more be sent to undesignated categories? Do I personally need to reawaken my own interest in the organization and see all the changes and possibilities that are available to me to learn and grow? One thing I do know is there is a lot to talk about and all will benefit from listening to

one another.

Resources that may be useful to your unit and answer questions are "Where the Money Goes 2023" and the "Supplementary Giving Projects 2023." Some local unit treasurers have them already. If you like I can send them to you in a PDF file or ask your District Treasurers for them.

First quarter giving was 30,888.60 and included 1,183 contributed from Endowment earnings in 2022.

Seeing the bigger picture of the impact United Women in Faith has on the global mission as well as here in the States has made me realize our footprint in a world where the least, the last, and the lost are increasing and need our support more than ever. As a non-profit, we depend on the generosity of our women to support these projects no matter where the need and location. We've come a long way from mothers collecting money for our organization by charging their children a penny if they left crumbs on the tablecloth. But penny by penny, our foremothers felt the importance of our mission work. If we don't have extra cash, we do have ways of fundraising for our pledge. Whether individually or by the unit, every penny counts.

WHERE THE MONEY GOES 2023

FIRST, LET'S HEAR ABOUT WHERE THE MONEY COMES FROM, THE SOURCES OF OUR FUNDING...

<u>United Women in Faith</u> is trusted with pledges and donations from individual members as well as mission partners and anonymous donors who have a heart for mission. The national office is committed to good stewardship of this generous support.

The Five Channels of Giving (pictured below) show the various ways that our members give undesignated funds to our organization. When local members give, a portion of the Pledge to Mission is kept by their respective unit and conference for its own administrative and membership development (A&MD) expenses as well as local mission. The remainder of the Pledge and the other channels of Mission Giving is forwarded to the national office. Therefore, our members' giving supports both local, national, and international work aligned with our mission! At the national level, the elected Board of Directors votes on the budgeted spending for each year.

Members can also give to projects on our <u>Designated</u> and



<u>Supplementary Projects List</u> which is updated each year. Visit this webpage to view the list: https:// uwfaith.org/who-we-are/financials/

In addition to these sources of funding, United Women in Faith also receives bequests and holds endowments that significantly support our work. We currently have an active Legacy Fund Endowment Campaign, which will be an ongoing support of income, ensuring that our important work will always continue.

Social Action and Justice Work

We mobilize our members to learn about and take action on key social justice issues. Currently, our focus is on climate justice and ending the school-to-prison pipeline.

Education and Leadership Development

We equip women, children, and youth to become leaders in the church, their communities, and the world. Programs include:

- Leadership Development Days
- Mission u
- Reading Program
- Scholarships to students in the United States and internationally

Spiritual Growth and Nurturing Opportunities

We offer resources and programming that enable women to explore their faith and nurture their souls, including:

- Daily Prayer Guide & Program Book
- Bible studies
- Soul care events
- Faith Talks

National Mission Institutions

We support nearly 90 NMIs across the United States that offer vital services to and advocate for women, children, and youth in vulnerable communities. In 2022, more than \$1.6 million was provided in grants to Community Centers, Residential Treatment Centers, and Women's Residences within the network.

International Mission

We support international partners that are enhancing the capacities of local and regional women leaders and supporting economic development programs for women and youth. We support Regional Missionaries and personnel serving in their home regions with the church and ecumenical and grassroots partners in educational and empowerment programs. Our international work empowers women and youth to find local solutions and make positive, measurable changes in their communities.

Office of Deaconess and Home Missioner

Deaconesses and Home Missioners are laypeople who are called by God to be in a lifetime relationship in The United Methodist Church for engagement with a full-time vocation in ministries of love, justice, and service. Together they form a covenant community that is rooted in Scripture, informed by history, driven by mission, ecumenical in scope, and global in outreach.

Organizational Support

Funds are also used to support services that are critical to making

In addition to the work mentioned above, we also own and operate the Church Center for the United Nations (CCUN) located in New York City across the street from the United Nations; and the Brooks-Howell Home Retirement Home, originally founded for deaconesses located in Asheville, NC. These operations are primarily funded by the rental and service fee income that they derive and are overseen by some of our national office staff.

Each year we release an Annual Report which describes the work we were able to do together and includes our audited financial information. You can read notes from our key leaders, see pictures and stories about projects, view the financial reports, and imagine the possibilities for the coming years! In addition to the work we do with our members on training, service, and social action, we award grants and scholarships to deserving organizations and individuals. The recipients and purposes of the grants and scholarships are released each year in our Grants Disclosure.

NEWS FROM THE WESTERN JURISDICTION TEAM

Much is happening as we get closer to the General Conference. United Women in Faith has 14 pieces of legislation to present, some to drop per relevancy, and some to be revised since the Book of Resolution expires every eight years. A Charter for Racial Justice would not be presented since Alaska Conference has already done so. More to come with specific information after the upcoming Board meeting.

Now is the time to explore and use the United Women in Faith website, uwfaith.org. For example, webinar links can be found if you cannot attend the one scheduled. Women's Speak Sunday is near, and beneficial information can be found. Don't forget uwfaith.org/resources/ to find what you want.

Know that our mission giving is down across the conferences. That, coupled with the disaffiliations of churches, has caused a severe shortfall in operating expenses for the organization. We must consider this a challenge to turn it up on our commitment. Along with all other conferences, we must give out of faith.

Currently, there are about 6.5% of churches disaffiliating in the US. It seems much higher in some areas of the USA, but it is not. This is why all conferences are creating an Outreach Action Plan. Our conference will create an up-to-date plan. In this time of change, we want to make all units feel connected. Churches with no units need to be reached out to as well.

We have a new set of deaconesses

and home missioners to be consecrated. If you would like more information about this fulfilling program, go online or contact svickory@uwfaith.com.

My report is before the Board meeting, but you will get updated information afterward. Please pray for our organization. Interviews for a new CEO are being conducted after Harriet Jane Olson announced her retirement.





community development in Nepal. She serves as a Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability, and Learning (MEAL) Advisor with the United Mission to Nepal (UMN). The ecumenical ministry of UMN has a vision of "fullness of life for all in a transformed Nepali society." Katherine's work in Nepal involves the development of frameworks for reflection in an action-reflection process of community transformation.

Katherine is passionate about the process of linking values to action. She believes in telling the stories of our lives and exploring the stories of our faith. These enable us to articulate our shared values and engage in collective action across cultural and other divisive barriers. Together we can progress towards a world where every person can live to their fullest potential.



Yvonne Agduyeng was born in the Philippines, immigrated to the United States as a child, and grew up in Kent, WA. She holds a biology and



We sign and decorate greeting cards at various times of the year for patients at State Hospital North, some of whom receive no other mail. This year we

are resuming, following a COVID three-year interruption, our May Community Ladies Luncheon, a served meal for 80-100 women, with a special program. This year's topic, "Look Around, Look Within" on Mental Health (May is Mental Health Month)), will be presented by our own Social Action Coordinator, Gini Woodward, who has vast experience with mental illness and advocacy for mental health. This special event reaches women from many local churches and some with no church connection for supportive fellowship, a spiritual component, education on the topic featured, and an opportunity to share invitations to their upcoming programs. We have welcomed five new members this year, two of whom are now officers, one who has assumed a special role, one who will be attending Retreat, and three others from our unit. Yes, our giving includes time, service, love, and finances, extending far beyond our local unit, whose members are growing in faith together.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE SEATAC DISTRICT PRESIDENT

Trinity United Women in Faith Making a Difference in the World:

Janice Bronkema, a United Women in Faith member at Trinity UMC in Ballard and our SeaTac District Spiritual Growth Coordinator, shared this story with me that I would like to share with all of you. Several years ago, Trinity United Women in Faith invited a speaker from the Fabric of Life store in Edmonds to one of their meetings. Established in 2009, this store sold items made by artisans from Mali in West Africa. The focus of the volunteer-run store was to help women in Mali, who were begging on the streets, become skilled artisans and eventually form their own cooperative. Due to high rents, the Fabric of Life store closed in 2018, but they were open long enough to enable the women in Bamako, Mali, to form their own cooperative.

Last summer, Janice ran into Carol from the Fabric of Life store, and she informed Janice that the money Trinity United Women in Faith provided at that meeting was enough for them to bring one young woman off the streets and place her in a skill training program. Naturally, Janice's Trinity United Women in Faith unit was thrilled to learn that they provided a path for a woman to leave Mali's streets and lead a better life as a self-supporting artisan. This is an excellent example of a United Women in Faith unit putting "Faith, Hope, and Love into Action."

UPDATES FROM UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH AT MASON UMC, TACOMA:

Carol Sprague, the new President at Mason United Women in Faith and our SeaTac District Program Resources Coordinator, shared this story with me. Carol has been attending Mason UMC since she moved to the Tacoma area in 2019, and she was saddened to learn that they were not meeting regularly. In the summer of 2022, Carol began the process of reinvigorating this unit. Since no one else was interested in leading this group, Carol volunteered to be president. They still need a secretary, but their past president offered to help with the finances, and Roberta Larsen has kept Mason's United Women in Faith Reading Program alive. Mason United Women in Faith is now meeting monthly and rotating between Tuesday and Saturday mornings. They started with five ladies at their first meeting, and seven came to their February meeting. One of the new ladies volunteered to do the program for their March meeting.

Carol is focusing their meetings on fellowship rather than on items of business. Coffee and snacks are provided, and each meeting begins with devotion and sharing joys and concerns. She is working with the ladies on program ideas, such as having guest speakers and doing craft projects related to women and children. One of their members has connections with Project Linus in Puyallup, and this is something they are considering. Project Linus is a national non-profit with chapters in

all 50 states, and they provide handmade blankets and afghan blankets to children who are ill, experiencing trauma, or just needing warmth and comfort. Carol is excited to be helping to grow the Mason United Women in Faith unit. This is another example of United Women in Faith members putting their "Faith, Hope, and Love into Action."

2023-2024 DR. GERTRUDE BOYD CRANE SCHOLARSHIP AVAILABLE

The Dr. Gertrude Boyd Crane Scholarship (GBC) is awarded by Oregon-Idaho United Women in Faith. It is intended for women in the Greater Northwest Episcopal Area, specifically Oregon-Idaho, Alaska, and Pacific Northwest Conferences, who are pursuing post-graduate studies toward a vocation in the church, not limited to ordained elders.

The scholarship is granted for a period of one year, with the possibility of renewal. Amounts vary from year to year and may be awarded to several individuals. On average, the scholarships have been \$2,000 each. The application and additional information, including letters of reference, must be received by July 5, 2023. The GBC Committee, charged with selecting recipients, includes United Women in Faith Conference President Chris Mitchell; former conference presidents Rochell Killett, Dixie Jacky, and Rebecca Warren; and Gayle Woods, appointed by the Conference President.

Dr. Gertrude Boyd Crane was an ordained elder in the Oregon-Idaho Conference. She was a theologian and professor at Pacific University in Forest Grove, Oregon. Her students knew her as a teacher, counselor, and one who helped out financially at critical times in her students' lives. In her will, she created a scholarship fund for women taking graduate studies toward a profession in the church. Since 1978 United Methodist Women, now United Women in Faith has awarded 100 of these scholarships.

Her students knew her as a teacher, counselor, and one who helped out financially at critical times in her students' lives. In her will, she created a scholarship fund for women taking postgraduate studies toward a profession in the church. Since 1978 United Methodist Women (now United Women in Faith) has awarded 100 scholarships.

Dr. Gertrude Boyd Crane Scholarship (GBC) is intended for women in the Greater Northwest Episcopal Area, specifically Oregon-Idaho, Alaska, and Pacific Northwest Conferences, pursuing graduate studies toward a vocation in the church, not limited to ordained elder. The scholarship is granted for one year, with the possibility of renewal upon submission of a current application and evidence of satisfactory progress.

Scholarship amounts vary yearly and may be awarded to several individuals. On average, the amount has been
