

Greetings from your Mission Education & Interpretation Coordinator

I am hoping many of you took the opportunity to hear one or more of our wonderful deaconesses as they made the rounds throughout our District. I am always so inspired by them and if you are, you can show them your support by making a contribution to the work they do.

Mission U will be here before we know it. I have sent in my registration form, have you? I don't know if we will have any free time but if we do, I would like to meet with you and we can talk about our opportunities and challenges.

My unit, Pioneer UWnF, has made a commitment to support the migrant families who come to the Walla Walla Valley to work in the vineyards and orchards. Did you know there are 9,000 migrants who come to work in orchards, etc along the Columbia River every year? What we learned this year is if the weather is bad, they are not able to work. This can be a challenge because they only make enough to pay their rent and put food on the table. Without consistent work and we know how hard the work is, it may not always be possible to meet their basic needs.

My unit provided 22 boxes of food, winter clothing, etc helped with baby showers this winter and provided bottled water, hats that protect their necks and faces from the burning sun last summer, etc. I would love to hear what speaks to your heart within your community.
