

It has been a few years since I have held a SeaTac Missional District board position. I am excited to be back on the board.



Trinity United Women in Faith Making a Difference

I am sharing a success story of my UWF unit. A few years ago, Trinity UWF at Trinity UMC in Seattle invited a speaker from the Fabric of Life store in Edmonds to one of our meetings.

The Fabric of Life store was established in 2009 and sold items made by artisans from Mali in West Africa. The main focus of the volunteer run store was to help women in Mali, who were begging on the streets, to become skilled artisans and eventually for them to form their own cooperative.

Carol, who established Fabric of Life, came to our meeting to speak. She brought many beautiful items from the store for us to look at and possibly buy. The best seller was paper made from Elephant poop. This item sold out at our meeting.

The Fabric of Life store closed in 2018, as the rent for the space was raised too high for the store to continue paying. However, the store was open long enough to allow the women in Bamako, Mali to form their own cooperative.

I ran into Carol, this past summer, and she told me that our unit had provided enough money at our meeting to bring one young woman off the streets and place her in a skill training program.

Our UWF unit was thrilled to know that we had been able to provide a path for a woman to leave the streets of Mali and to hopefully a better life as a self-supporting artisan.

We do a devotion and have joys and **W** concerns moments at the start of the meeting.

I am working with the ladies to try to have a special program each month. Maybe someone they know who can come speak or have a craft project we can do related to women and children. We have one lady who knows a Native American and she may have him come one month. We are still in the initial stages of finding a local mission we can support all year long. One of w the ladies has connections with Project Linus out of Puyallup that provides **W** blankets and quilts, etc. for children.

I haven't incorporated things like the Prayer Calendar or designated programs from the Program book, or talked about pledges yet. I'm taking baby steps in 2023!



<u>WE PRAY WITH HER</u> was written by a group of United Methodist clergy women. It is on the 2020 Reading Program in the Spiritual Growth category. The foreword was written by Ginger Gaines-Cirelli, author of Sacred Resistance, a 2022 UWF book selection.

"We" includes all of us, "Pray" is understanding the God is always present in our daily lives, "With" is the word that joins us with others experiencing the same things, and "Her" is the woman at every age and stage of life. She is a beloved child of God.

WE PRAY WITH HER is a book of 100 devotions that is divided into sections:

Call - that sense of knowing God is calling you in a way of making a difference in the world; Struggle - you find some measure of grace knowing you are not alone but know that God is walking with you through your difficult time; Courage - helps us to do what we know we are called to do, even in the face of fear to be courageous in our daily life; Resistance - seeing the positive and negative aspects of the world and feeling God moving within us to work for change; and

Persistence - knowing we must continue the direction of our faith and call and knowing that God keeps persisting.

Each devotion is a couple pages that includes a Bible verse, personal insights, and a prayer. Some excerpts from the book: "It's always easier to remain in our predetermined, comfortable, places than to hit the road with Jess; but only in following him can we truly find the better part."

Mark 14:35-36 "Jesus, hear me as I echo your cry; take this cup from me. Fill me with your spirit that I may have the strength to say the next part of your prayer: not what I want, but what you want. Amen"

"Remember when you are afraid, take heart and place your words,, your actions and your very being into God's hands."

"What would you do today if you knew, without a doubt, that God's presence would follow you and fill every need wherever you go?"

"I pray for boldness. Give me the strength to speak and the words to say. Give me the spirit of power so that I might deliver your message in a way that changes things."

Philippians 4:13 "We can do all things through Christ who strengthens us." By his steadfast presence, there is no challenge we cannot endure. Whether you are a woman leader, a woman in a supportive role, or a woman who wants to support her sisters in Christ, these devotions will touch your heart. I hope you will pick up this book at your local library, read it on your Kindle or purchase it and share with other women.
