United Women In Faith is trusted with pledges and donations from individuals, mission partners and other donors dedicated to missions. The National office is committed to careful stewardship of this generous support. Mission giving is divided into five channels of undesignated giving, representing local, national and international work, (1)Pledge to Mission, (2)World Thank Offering,(3) Special Mission Recognition, (4)Gift in Memory and(5) Gift to Mission.

Members can also give to projects on the designated and supplementary list. Some administrative costs come out of Pledge to Mission for local, Conference and National support and leadership development.

#### But where does it go?

Over 90 National Mission Institutions serving marginalized and vulnerable communities caring for and involving children and youth.

Regional Missionaries focusing on issues of health, gender equality and


