
HAIL, HAIL, OUR LEADERS ARE HERE!

PRESIDENT

Builds a District team where relationships with each other and with our units is a priority in accordance with our PURPOSE. Work with the Executive Team in receiving, evaluating and preparing reports. Serve as a contact person for local presidents, provide resources, and conduct training at least annually. Write an article for each issue of "The Flame" district newsletter. Provide each member of the District Executive Committee with an agenda for all meetings. Must Attend; Executive meetings, Annual Meeting, District Leadership Training, Mission u, Annual Conference.



NADINE GRIFFIN

VICE-PRESIDENT

Recruits local host units and location for District events and produces an annual event hosting calendar no less than 6 months prior to the new year. Recommends themes for each year's events and leads the team in setting innovative and exciting programs for District events and incorporates the annual program book into planning activities. Is responsible for production of the District Leadership Exploration and Development event. Trains counterparts at least once a year & shepherds units for requests. Performs the duties of the President in her absence.

TREASURER

Collects Mission Giving statistics to report to the Conference Treasurer and to present certificates for Units at the District Annual Meeting and include; Pledge to Mission, Special Mission Recognition, Gift in Memory cards, World Thank Offering, Mission Magic, and Love Ribbon cards. The Treasurer and E & I Coordinator perform the lighting of the Mission Today Candle at the District Annual Meeting. Performs the annual Pledge Service at the District Annual Meeting. Presents the District Annual Budget for approval and adoption with the amount to be Pledged to Mission for the upcoming year at the District Annual Meeting. Trains counterparts at least once each year and shepherds units from any requesting unit.



SECRETARY

The Secretary records minutes of Executive meetings to include all motions and summary of discussions on agenda items and is responsible for approval and distribution to all District Executive Officers, designated PNW Conference Officers. Produces a summary of the Fall planning meeting and Spring budget meeting and any motions made as a result of these sessions. Produces the Annual Directory of the District in November for distribution and ensures that a copy goes to the D.S., Conference Team. Ensures that all information in the Directory includes each unit's active member count, church phone number and street address, pastor, and meeting schedule. The Secretary performs roll call of each unit at the District Annual Meeting. Serves as custodian of all records. Serves as contact person for all local unit secretaries, trains counterparts at least once each year, shepherds units for any requesting unit.




COMMUNICATIONS COORDINATOR

EDELWISA GONZAGA The Communication Coordinator shall produce 3 – 4 newsletters each year announcing each District event and containing registration form inserts for upcoming events. Set the theme for each newsletter in conjunction with the President. Produce a schedule for production including a deadline and mailing schedule. Recruits from each Executive Officer an article with priority for the front page being the upcoming event. Encourage units to contribute to the newsletter. Updates and maintains the mailing list and email distribution. Coordinates with the Conference Communication Coordinator, Annual Conference Office, D.S. Office to get our news out to churches. Serves as contact person for local unit counterparts, shepherds any unit requesting.

PROGRAM RESOURCE SECRETARY

The Program Resource Secretary is responsible for submitting names of all District Executive Team members to the Mission Resource Center for the annual sampler, Resource Handbook, Mission U study book and any other approved resource items. Produces resource rooms at all District events. Submits a reading program of 5 books, one from each category, for the District Team to read each year. Provides a book summary for each newsletter. Ensures that each unit has access to the annual reading program list. Receives and processes all unit reading program readers and presents certificates at the District Annual Meeting, forwarding this information to the UWF Conference for printing in their program book. Serves as contact person for local unit Program Secretaries and trains counterparts at least once each year and shepherds units from any requesting unit.

MISSION COORDINATOR- SPIRITUAL GROWTH: LISA RIEDINGER

The Spiritual Growth Coordinator is called on at Executive meetings, planning sessions and events to provide inspiration that may include; grace, devotions, prayer, litany, leading songs, provide focal point, organizing a love feast, and more. Is responsible for the Spiritual Day Apart event. Works with local units to provide assistance as needed in planning and holding a Call to Prayer and Self-Denial and reflection program and the World Day of Prayer. Relates to MNO (Membership, Nurture & Outreach) Coordinator on explaining Biblical and theological basis for building and nurturing an inclusive community. Relates to Social Action Coordinator on interpreting the Bible and theological basis for social action. Relates to the E & I Coordinator on defining the Biblical and theological basis for mission and mission giving. Educates women about the relationship between personal spiritual development and mission. Serves as contact person for local units and trains counterparts at least once each year and shepherds units from any requesting unit.

MISSION COORDINATOR - SOCIAL ACTION: JA NET' CROUSE


The Social Action Coordinator is responsible for coordination of the Faith Advocacy Days with the Conference Social Action Coordinator and other producers of the event. Develops annual social action priorities for adoption by the District team based on the priorities proposed by the PNW UMW Conference to include one more in each of the following categories; Global, National, and local. Works with each unit implementing the Racial Justice Charter Club program. Gathers reports from the units and presents Charter certificates to qualifying units at the annual meeting of the District. Forwards the information to the Conference Social Action. Subscribes to the National UMW Action Alerts and incorporates the alerts into action items with units. Serves as contact person for local units' Social Action and trains counterparts at least once each year and shepherds units from requests.

MISSION COORDINATOR – EDUCATION & INTERPRETATION: MYRA SALAPANG–DUNCAN The Mission Education & Interpretation (E & I) promotes and Interprets the work of the General Board of Global Ministries supported by UMW, promotes and interprets the need for undesignated giving to undergird the program of Global Ministries, with special emphasis on women, children and youth. Works with local units to set goals in becoming a Mission Today Unit in the Seven Rivers District. Works to educate on criteria of Gold, Silver, and Bronze unit and five columns of Mission priorities as applicable. Receives and processes all unit mission today reports and presents certificates to qualifying units and to forward to Conference E & I. Staff, receive payment, and reconcile receipts for display and sales of Love Ribbons, Gift to Mission cards at each event and arrange for display of quilts, prayer shawls, and other items needed for women, children, and youth. Submit monies to the District Treasurer. Help women understand the mission and outreach ministries of the church, including covenant relationships with missionaries. Incorporate the Five Columns of Mission priorities. Serve as District Liaison for Mission U. Work with the Treasurer to provide support and training with local units on mission giving.

MISSION COORDINATOR - MEMBERSHIP, NURTURE & OUTREACH: MARSHA AUFENKAMP

THE MEMBERSHIP, NURTURE & OUTREACH COORDINATOR WORKS WITH INACTIVE UNITS OF THE DISTRICT TO HELP BRING THEM INTO ACTIVE STATUS. ENCOURAGE THE USE OF THE BROCHURE "JOYS OF MEMBERSHIP" FROM NATIONAL TO GAIN ENROLLMENT AND PLEDGE COMMITMENTS. RESPONSIBLE FOR DISTRIBUTING AND COLLECTING YEAR END MEMBERSHIP COUNT REPORTS FROM UNITS AND FORWARDING TO CONFERENCE. OBTAIN A LIST OF MEMBERS WHO HAVE DIED FROM UNITS AND FORWARD TO CONFERENCE MNO IN ACCORDANCE WITH ESTABLISHED REPORTING DEADLINES. DEVELOP AND PRODUCE ANNUAL MEMORIAL REMEMBRANCE SERVICE AT THE DISTRICT ANNUAL MEETING EACH YEAR. TOGETHER, WITH THE TREASURER, HOST THE REGISTRATION TABLE AND PRODUCE NAME TAGS FOR THESE EVENTS. APPLIES TEAM BUILDING EXERCISE AT EXECUTIVE MEETINGS AND PLANNING SESSIONS AS NEEDED. IMPLEMENT THE "MEMBERSHIP COUNTS" PROGRAM OF UWF NATIONAL, DESIGNED TO GROW MEMBERSHIP AND LEADERSHIP IN EXISTING UNITS. THE MNO COORDINATORS FOCUS ON NURTURING, ASSIST IN CREATING AN ENVIRONMENT WHICH INVITES, WELCOMES, INCLUDES AND ACCEPTS ALL WOMEN. SERVES AS A CONTACT PERSON FOR LOCAL MNO AND TRAINS AT LEAST ONCE A YEAR AND SHEPHERDS REQUESTING UNITS.

CHAIR OF COMMITTEE ON NOMINATIONS AND COMMITTEE MEMBERS: CHAIR AND AT LEAST THREE OTHERS, ELECTED FOR A FOUR YEAR TERM. CHAR PERFORMS THE INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS' SERVICE AT THE DISTRICT ANNUAL MEETING. CHAIR IMPLEMENTS THE RECRUITMENT PROCESS AND PROCEDURES LISTED IN THE STANDING RULES AND OPERATING PROCEDURES. ARE FULL MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE TEAM. THE RECRUITING CAMPAIGN SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, UNIT VISITATIONS, CONTACTS WITH DISTRICT AND CONFERENCE EVENT ATTENDEES. VACANCIES ARE FILLED OUTSIDE THE DISTRICT ANNUAL MEETING, APPROVED WITH A VOTE OF THE EXECUTIVE MEETING. CHAIR TRAINS COUNTERPARTS AT LEAST ONCE EACH YEAR, SHEPHERDS UNITS AS REQUESTED.


