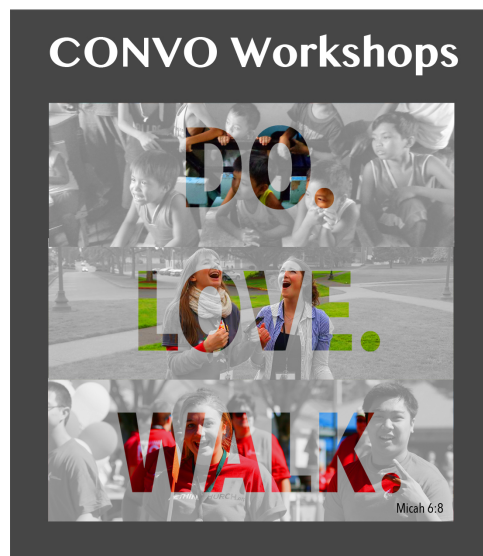
LARPing/Boffing (LARP) | *Jake & Jim Mahugh*
